



Inspiration for the week

Being real people of faith comes with a price. Have you ever been seen as unpopular, out of sync or peculiar because of your faith? St. Peter tells us, "If you are insulted for the name of Christ, blessed are you." If being a Christian comes easy for us, then we ought to rethink how we approach our faith. Developing habits of prayer, living in accord with the Gospel, setting time aside each week for the practice of our faith, seeing our relationship with Christ as the center and focus of our families all come with sacrifice. We are going to look differently than other folks and we ought to. We are going to find ourselves doing less of the things we are "supposed to do" and more of the things we know we "ought to do or want to do." This often means resisting secular tides and putting our boats into different waters. If this is what helps us know the one true God, then so be it. It also brings us to eternal life.

Updates on Reopening the Parish

Archbishop Hartmayer has extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until June 28th. He is also allowing Parishes to reopen in a "careful measured approach" at their discretion as early as Pentecost eve. He remarked that the theme for reopening will be "come Holy Spirit, fill us and renew us." His video message is available at https://vimeo.com/419672293.

St. Anthony of Padua will make an extremely reserved and cautious return over the next few months. Fr. Vic will share his vision for our Parish during Mass this Sunday. A few highlights are that a handful of reservations for attendance at the live tapings of virtual Masses will be taken on a first-come -first-serve basis. Those families will wait in their cars until a Hospitality Minister asks them to enter the church and they will stay in one of six zones for the duration. All persons will have their temperatures checked and must wear facemasks brought from home. Hand sanitizer will be available for use and bringing your own from home is encouraged. The continued health for the people of our Parish is at the forefront of all decisions and interim safety protocols.
