Homeless Ministry Service Opportunity

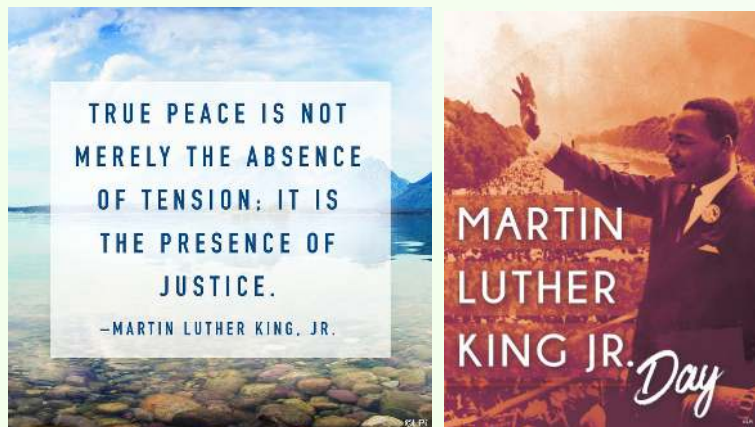
